
Edinburgh Geological Society – Excursion Planning Form





Excursion summary:	Start from Harlaw Carpark, go via the Ranger's centre, south beside Harlaw Reservoir, looking at interbedded sandstones and mudstones of the Lower Carboniferous Ballagan Formation, then crossing Kinnesswood sandstones to Black Springs and on to the flank of Black Hill microgranite, which is related to the volcanic rocks of the Pentland Hills. We continue to the meltwater channel at White Cleugh.
Meeting point:	Harlaw Reservoir Carpark NT 181655
Outline of the excursion route:	Harlaw C'park, Ranger's Centre, Black Springs, White Cleugh & return
Terrain, walking distance, height gain:	Walking distance about 5 km, height gain up to 200m.
	Mainly on paths but some steep slopes, rough or muddy ground.
	Some exposures are close to water, be careful not to fall in.
